Dispute erupts over boy's haircut

A Belmont family has filed a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights, alleging discrimination after their 5-year-old son was told his haircut was not acceptable at a Catholic school.

After Catholic school sends him home, parents file complaint with federal agency

The complaint alleges that the Immaculate Heart of Mary School, a Catholic school at 1000 Alameda de las Pulgas, discriminated against Jalyn Broussard, who is

black, because of his race. He was in kindergarten when he was told in December that his haircut was not acceptable and he would have to go home, said his mother Mariana

Broussard. She said that his haircut was a "modern fade" where the hair is longer in the middle and shorter on the sides. But his teacher, and then the principal Teri Grosey, said that the haircut was a "faux hawk" which is not allowed on school grounds as outlined by the school's

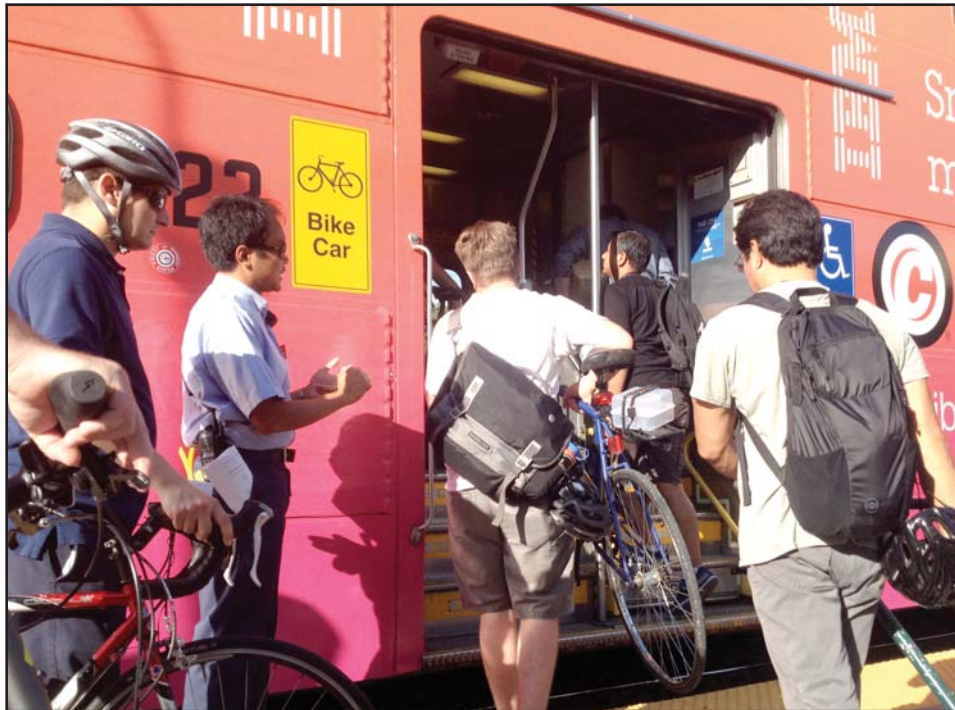

GREECE DEFAULTS: Greece slipped deeper into its financial abyss after the bailout program it has relied on for five years expired yesterday and the country failed to repay a \$1.8 billion loan due to the International Monetary Fund, deepening fears over whether it will be able to remain in the eurozone.

CUBA, U.S. EMBASSIES: President Obama will announce today that the U.S. and Cuba will reopen embassies in each other's capitals, a major step in ending hostilities between the Cold War foes.

Yee may get plea bargain

Former state Sen. Leland Yee, the Democrat who represented parts of San Mateo County and San Francisco before he was arrested in an organized crime and public corruption case, appears to have reached a plea bargain with federal prosecutors.

Yee, who previously has pleaded innocent to bribery, money laundering and other felony charges, was scheduled to go on trial in late July along with three co-defendants. But a judge has scheduled change-of-plea [See YEE, page 26]

Palo Alto's Cordell meets Kardashian
